Funding Needs

The 2025 class is expected to have about 15-20 first-year students with no prior computer science experience.

To expand access and increase our impact, SCI is seeking:

- \$3,500 per student for a summer internship with one of Pitt's Community Engagement Centers
- \$50,000 will support 15 students for two years

Your investment will directly enable more students to gain critical computing skills, regardless of their background or field of study.
